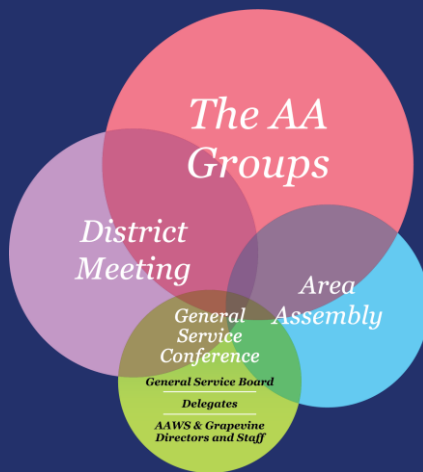

A.A.'s Twelfth Step suggests that we carry the message of recovery.

That is the basic service that A.A. provides.

Any action that helps A.A. to function as a whole is service.

Most A.A. members start out providing service in their group.

How A.A.s work together to help alcoholic who still suffers.

The A.A. Groups

Each group has a say in worldwide A.A. through its general service representative

- The GSR represents the voice of the group conscience and links his or her group with A.A. as a whole.

District Meeting

Who carries the group's thinking on various A.A. issues to the district for consideration

- GSRs and DCMs attend district committee meetings and also go to the area assembly where matters affecting the entire area are discussed.

Area Assembly

Along with the area committee, made up of its officers and district committee members

- Each assembly considers a variety of issues relative to carrying the A.A. message and elects its delegate to the General Service Conference.

General Service Conference

General Service Board; Delegates; AAWS & Grapevine Directors and Staff

- From the Conference, the shared experience of all groups goes back to the assembly, where each delegate reports on the Conference. Area Assembly
- DCMs take information about A.A. worldwide back to their districts and GSRs report to their groups on the deliberations of the Conference.
- Group members receive information on Conference Actions that affect A.A. unity, health, and growth.

NOW Group was formed and registered with WSO in 1981. The group started at the pool house of an apartment complex where a few newly sober members lived. The group has moved a few times - locations include a former barroom, a church, and the Central Office. Francis Asbury Methodist has been our home since 2020. We have a great symbiotic relationship with the church.

During the '90s, we were known as the "biker group" as most of our members rode Harleys. That wild spirit carried into our many group activities - camping, group hikes, bike rides, cookouts, pool parties, canoe trips, and more. We continue to enjoy these functions today. We are not a glum lot, and we make sure the newcomer gets this point!

Our meeting format is closed discussion and have almost always had all service positions filled. We also conduct group inventories regularly. Service rotations, attendance at Area Assembly (and now District 11), CO meetings, and monetary disbursements as suggested by WSO are not only part of our responsibility to the Fellowship, but also priorities we value as a group.

NOW Group has hosted unity events; members serve as officers in area assembly; members have been guest speakers at numerous workshops, panels, old-timers' panels (ha-ha), conferences, and state and regional conventions. NOW members' sobriety ranges from 0 to 46 years.
